Students who take the PSAT/NMSQT, PSAT 10, and PSAT 8/9 see grade-level benchmarks on their score reports. Grade-level benchmarks indicate whether students are on track for college and career readiness. They are based on expected student growth toward SAT benchmarks at each grade. Preliminary benchmarks were used for the 2015 PSAT/NMSQT and fall PSAT 8/9 scores.

Benchmarks Cut Scores And Growth Rates

For example, if a student had a score for CBMreading in the fall and winter of the school year, the Growth Report would determine the average weekly growth between those two scores. This is called the Rate of Improvement (ROI). ROI is also reported on some individual student reports.

Benchmarks, Norms, and Expected Student Growth - FastBridge

SGPs range from 1-99 and interpretation is similar to percentile rank (PR) scores: lower numbers indicate lower relative growth and higher numbers indicate higher relative growth. For example, an SGP of 75 means the student's growth exceeds the growth of 75 percent of students with a similar score history.

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
