The future play may involve a wild game with opposite-side castling, or an attempt by White to slowly squeeze Black using his space advantage. Pros:

I used to play the King's Indian Defence as Black only when opponents committed to an early Nf3, and I would switch to the Janowski Indian, Tango or Budapest if they didn't. This way I could avoid the dreaded Four Pawns Attack and Sämisch Variation. But I recently decided to commit to the King's Indian completely, which means learning a defense against everything White can throw at you.
