The three types of solution sets: A system of linear equations can have no solution, a unique solution or infinitely many solutions. A system has no solution if the equations are inconsistent, they are contradictory. for example $2x+3y=10$, $2x+3y=12$ has no solution. is the rref form of the matrix for this system.

A solution of a linear system is an assignment of values to the variables x_1, x_2, \dots, x_n such that each of the equations is satisfied. The set of all possible solutions is called the solution set. A linear system may behave in any one of three possible ways: The system has infinitely many solutions.; The system has a single unique solution.; The system has no solution.

Recall that a linear equation graphs as a line, which indicates that all of the points on the line are solutions to that linear equation. There are an infinite number of solutions. As we saw in the last section, if you have a system of linear equations that intersect at one point, this point is a solution to the system.

In linear algebra, Cramer's rule is an explicit formula for the solution of a system of linear equations with as many equations as unknowns, valid whenever the system has a unique solution. It expresses the solution in terms of the determinants of the (square) coefficient matrix and of matrices obtained from it by replacing one column by the column vector of right-hand-sides of the equations.

Condition for Unique Solution to Linear Equations. A system of linear equations $ax + by + c = 0$ and $dx + ey + g = 0$ will have a unique solution if the two lines represented by the equations $ax + by + c = 0$ and $dx + ey + g = 0$ intersect at a point. i.e., if the two lines are neither parallel nor coincident.

In order for a linear programming problem to have a unique ...
A linear system with a unique solution has a solution set with one element. A linear system with no solution has a solution set that is empty. In these cases the solution set is easy to describe. Solution sets are a challenge to describe only when they contain many elements.
